• Why do you think Paul singled out these particular things as examples? How does that fit in with the context of ch. 12 & 14? (how do you connect what he says about love with what he says about spiritual gifts in 12.31 and 14.1 about seeking spiritual gifts?)

• What do you think he means when he says "but have not love"? How do we make sure that isn't true of us in our service and worship?

• Why do you think this chapter is focussed on our love for one another and not directly on loving God? What is the relationship between the two? (see 1 John 4. 11, 19-21)

• 4 things were listed in the sermon as ways to embrace the love of God for us (community, confession, thanksgiving, pursuit of God in His Word). Are there other practices that help you grasp the love of God for you? and which of these 4 (or others mentioned) is one you need to pursue?
