

NWC Questions

for Personal Study and Small Groups 12/11/11

1 Corinthians in Review

Focus: *to call the church to remember and obey that which God has been teaching them through the study of 1 Cor.*

Have your group see if they can remember the labels given to the 5 "file drawers" in 1 Corinthians:

- 1-4 Unity
- 5-6 Immorality
- 7-10 Liberty
- 11-14 Worship
- 15-16 Resurrection

Ask them what God has been bringing to mind from our study of 1 Cor. that is their biggest "takeaway"? If your group has come prepared to share, jump right in! Otherwise, you may want to give them 10 -15 minutes to flip back through the book prayerfully and remember what God has been saying to them through this past year.

Use the entire time sharing what God has been teaching them and praying about these things together. Here are some additional prompting questions if you need them:

- How has God shown Himself to you through 1 Cor.?
- Do you remember any particular verses or sermons that were especially convicting to you? (encourage them to look at their sermon notes or journals)
- In what ways are we most like the Corinthian church? Where did you most see yourself in this letter?
- If the Corinthians were to address one single core issue, what would you think it should be? How are you doing in that area?
