## **Review:**

- see if your group can reconstruct from memory the three truths that underlie the doctrine of the Trinity.
  - 1. God is one.
  - 2. God exists in three persons.
  - 3. The three persons are each fully God.
- What were the two main truths we reflected on about the Father last week?
  - 1. He rules over all (even His Son) 1 Cor. 15.28
  - 2. He loves (especially His Son) Jn. 17.23-26

## On God the Son:

- Read John 5.18-30 and discuss how you see:

- 1. Jesus' deity
- 2. His submission to the Father
- What makes those two things hard to put together in our minds (Jesus being equal with the Father and submitting to the Father)?
- Read the following passages about Jesus' loving obedience to His Father and discuss whether you think our culture "gets" the connection between obedience and love.

- Read 2 Tim. 3.2-4 and 1 John 4.7-12. How can we fuel our love for God and not towards self?
- How ought the loving relationship amongst the Trinity be shaping your home?

key passages: 1 Cor. 11:3; Eph. 5.22-30; 6.1-4



- focus on steps to fuel our love for God and ways that love should be shaping our home.
