• How is God's faithfulness displayed in vv. 12-13, 15-16? How does that affect the way you think about God? about your own obedience?

• What is Joshua concerned might lead the away from faithfully following God's ways (cf. vv. 7, 12)? What are the things that tempt us to unfaithfulness in our culture?

• What most encourages you from this passage? what most challenges you? What is your most significant takeaway?
